

WILLIAM C. "JACK" DAVIS


"John Breckinridge and the Flight of the Confederate Government, the Fall of Richmond, His Escape, and His Exile: Preparing A Screenplay."

ILLIAM C. "JACK" DAVIS, retired Executive Director of the Virginia Center for Civil War Studies and Professor of History at Virginia Tech, previously spent 31 years in editorial and marketing management in the book and magazine publishing industry. He has consulted for numerous film and television productions and was senior advisor for the A&E and History Channel series "Civil War Journal." Davis is the author or editor of more than sixty books on the subject of Civil War and Southern history, and most recently co-edited with Sue Heth Bell, *The Whartons' War: The Civil War Correspondence of General Gabriel C. Wharton & Anne Radford Wharton, 1863-1865.* He is currently working with Ron Maxwell, director of the epic films "Gettysburg" and "Gods and Generals," on two docudrama series for television. •

s we close out this year, we continue to work on improving the Roundtable's finances. We ended September with \$11,119 in our operating account and a certificate of deposit in the amount of \$25,000. We are starting to receive current membership dues for the new year, and we currently count membership numbers of 207. We have already added three new memberships. To date we have received 98 membership dues payments, and we anxiously await the other 109 membership payments in the short term. A continuing push will be in growing new memberships.

Even with membership growth, we will still need to do additional fundraising and look for ways to increase our financial base. Thank you for your continued support of the Kentucky Civil War Roundtable.



REPORT FROM MARK HENDERSON: CWRT SUSTAINABILITY CONFERENCE

he Civil War Roundtable Congress held its 2023 Sustainability Conference at the Adams County Historical Society Museum in Gettysburg on August 25th through 27th. Members of Civil War Roundtables from around the country met to discuss membership expansion and retention issues. CWRT groups ranging from less than 25 members to over 100 members were represented.

Regardless of membership size, each CWRT group expressed similar concerns about flat or declining membership and the difficulty in attracting younger members. There were no one-size-fits-all answers, but plenty of ideas worthy of further discussion for the Kentucky Civil War Roundtable.

The CWRT Congress has a Sustainability Challenge program to assist Roundtables to improve sustainability by providing a rewarding experience for members. The CWRT Congress has voluntary participation with no membership or dues requirements. Its primary mission is to provide free services to help inspire and assist CWRT leaders to adapt, adopt and maintain strategies for sustainability. Their website is www.cwrtcongress.org.

CAMP NELSON NATIONAL MONUMENT

3rd Annual Luminaria and Memorial Walk, Saturday, November 11th (6:00 pm – 7:00 pm). The National Park Service invites you to participate in the 3rd Annual Remembrance Memorial and Luminaria Walk to mark the anniversary of Camp Nelson's largest expulsion. On November 23, 1864, the US Army forcibly expelled four hundred African American refugees from the camp during a winter storm, resulting in the deaths of 102 people. The November Expulsion garnered national attention and led to the establishment of the Home for Colored Refugees at Camp Nelson. On March 3, 1865, Congress passed legislation emancipating the wives and children of US Colored Troops.

The special event will feature interpretive talks by NPS staff and special guests, and a guided walk to Graveyard No. 1, where over one hundred luminaries will be lit to honor the people expelled and other freedom seekers who sought refuge at Camp Nelson. The ½ mile walk will be conducted over paved roads and a mowed grass path. Visitors should wear comfortable shoes/boots and warm clothing and bring flashlights.
